

An Anti-Bullying Charter for Stockport Schools

'Bullying is behaviour by an individual or a group which is usually repeated over time, where an imbalance of power is used to intentionally hurt another either physically or emotionally.'

Our school community will:

- Take seriously every incident where a person feels they have been harmed, in order to establish a respectful community ethos.
- Work with staff, pupils and parents/carers to create a school community where bullying is not tolerated.
- Discuss, monitor and review our anti-bullying policy on a regular basis. Good practice suggests the policy be reviewed every two years.
- Support staff to promote positive relationships, identify and tackle bullying appropriately.
- Ensure that pupils are aware that all bullying concerns will be dealt with sensitively and effectively so that they feel safe to learn.
- Investigate incidents of bullying and take action where necessary, supporting individuals when this takes place.
- Abide by the anti-bullying policy.
- Report back quickly to parents/carers regarding any concerns on bullying and deal promptly with complaints. Parents/carers in turn will work with the school to uphold the anti-bullying policy.
- Learn from other anti-bullying good practice elsewhere, and utilise the support of the Local Authority and other agencies where appropriate.
