We did a Birdwatch and admired the beautiful, Spring daffodils during Forest School today.


















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

We continue to promote the benefits of healthy snacks and how eating fruit can reduce litter and single use plastics. Free school fruit is always available to the children at break times.














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### Litter









Our Eco Warriors went around the school grounds looking to pick up litter with their litter pickers. Very little litter was found so a big 'well done' to all of the children!


