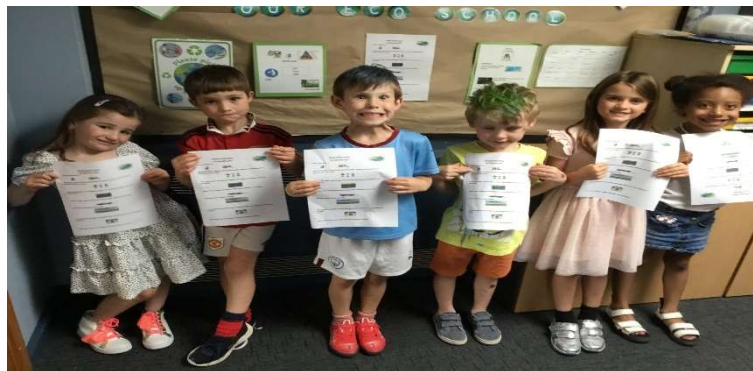

Oliver: "Trees give us oxygen."

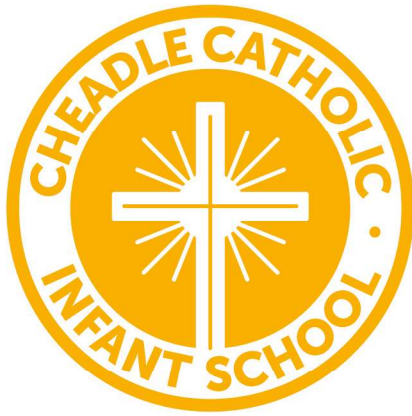
Cillian: "Trees give us fruit to eat."

Thank you for sharing these very important messages and reminding us how important it is to look after our world.



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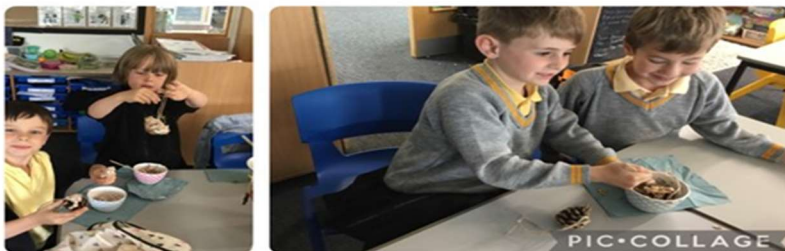
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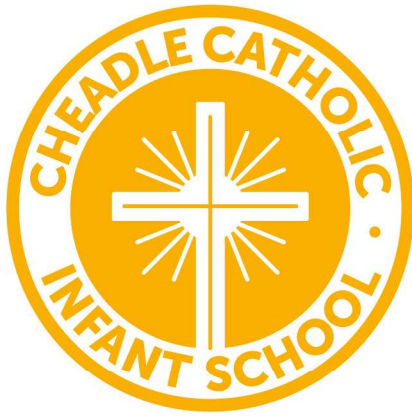
Year One

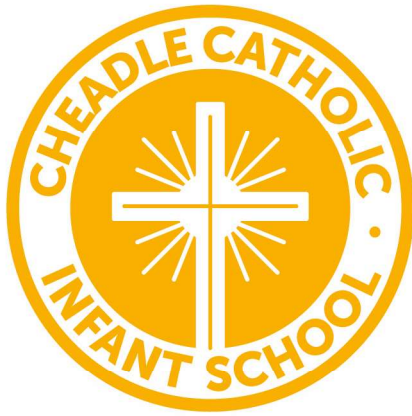
