What is the SEND Code of Practice?



What is a Special Educational Need?

Some children, while in education, may find learning more difficult than others.

This means they may have difficulty with:

- Reading, writing and mathematics
- Understanding information
 and expressing themselves
- Organising themselves
- Managing their behavior
- Making friends and relating to adults
- Sensory difficulties
- Physical mobility

These difficulties can be barriers to their learning. Staff at Cheadle Catholic Infant School will work with you to identify their strengths, needs and where to give support where needed.

If you are worried or concerned about your child's education, please feel free to speak to your child's Class Teacher or make an appointment to see myself.

What happens if my child is on the SEND register?

If your child requires additional support the Class Teacher will have an initial meeting with you to explain the SEND process. After this meeting, we will work with you to coproduce a SEND plan along with a One Page Profile. This profile details the strengths of your child as well as describing ways in how to best support your child at school.

Whilst on a SEND Plan your child will placed on the School's SEND register.

If your child is on the SEND register this means your child may need any of the following:

- Extra help in class in any of the following areas:
 - Cognition and Learning
 - Sensory and Physical
 - Communication and Interaction
 - Social Emotional and Mental Health
 - Preparation for adulthood.
- Advice from agencies such as Inclusion, Behaviour Support, Learning Support, Educational Psychologists, Sensory Support, Speech and Language Therapy or Occupational Therapy.

What is a SEND Plan?

This is a plan that will outline your child's strengths and SEND needs. The Class Teacher will set manageable and achievable targets for your child, which will be reviewed regularly, usually once a term.

Some children may only have a SEND plan for a term and some have it throughout school. They allow the Class Teacher and SENCO to ensure that the child is getting the best support possible.

Class Teachers will review these SEND Plans with you each term and they are checked by the SENCO. You will then be given a copy to keep at home.

If you have any questions about your child's SEND Plan, please contact your child's class teacher or myself (SENCO)

What is an EHCP?

If your child's needs are long term and complex, then they may be eligible for an Educational, Health and Care Plan.

School will work alongside yourselves and the Local Authority to gather evidence, which will be submitted to a panel of professionals, who will decide if your child would benefit from an EHCP. If you have any questions about this, please feel free to contact me.
