Monday Assembly:

On Monday we marked the beginning of Anti-Bullying Week with a whole school assembly. The theme of this year's week has been 'Power for Good.'

Throughout the week we have sent a clear and positive message that bullying is not acceptable in our school or community.

We talked about the importance of speaking to somebody if it happens to us or if we see it happening.

We have reminded our children that bullying is a behaviour that can hurt inside emotionally or on the outside physically and is intentionally repeated over time.


This week, Reception & Nursery celebrated anti-bullying week by thinking about how special our friends are. We passed a compliment around the circle with a piece of string until we were all connected together!



Year 1:

Year 1 learned how to spot bullying. We know it is when someone is unkind on purpose and keeps doing it. We thought about how to keep ourselves and our friends safe by knowing what to do and who to tell.

We talked about our "Power for Good," which is kindness. We love sharing all the different ways we can be kind to each other!



Year 2:

This week in Year 2 we have watched a video called 'For the Birds' and talked about different forms that bullying might take eg ignoring people, laughing at them, whispering unkind things as well as more obvious signs like hurting people. We also read a book called 'Mr Big'. The children thought carefully about how the characters interacted with Mr Big, why they were scared of him and also explored the idea that we really need to give people a chance and get to know them, rather than judging them by their appearance.

Our Squirrels, Beavers and Rainbows also came to school in their uniforms on Tuesday in order to celebrate Remembrance Day




Class 2W Parent Prayer & Liturgy:



We call them the 4Ts. If you or your child are weeing more often, constantly thirsty, more tired than usual, or losing weight for no reason, it could be a symptom of type 1 diabetes. If left undiagnosed, type 1 diabetes can be fatal. If you're experiencing any of the 4Ts, ask your doctor for a blood test immediately. It only takes seconds, but it could save your life.
