Manchester Airport Eco-Garden Competition



On Tuesday we were crowned winners of Manchester Airport's eco-garden competition.

Our presentation captured the imagination of a panel of judges, including trustees from the airport's Community Trust Fund. As a result we have secured an amazing £25,000 grant for a new eco-friendly outdoor learning space!!

We will use the funding to create a sustainable community allotment, growing produce that will then be cooked, a 'forest school' designed to attract native plants and wildlife, and an open-air classroom complete with a weather station that will be used in science and geography sessions.

We are so proud of all of the children in school who have helped us to come up with our garden design and proposal.

We would like to thank our Forest School lead Mrs Marshall who spearheaded the campaign so brilliantly.

Her enthusiasm for the project was contagious and evident in our winning pitch and we cannot wait to see how the prize will transform our Forest School. There was a whole army of parent volunteers who supported Mrs Marshall in this winning bid and I would also like to thank the rest of the PSA



Committee for their support and to Mr Marshall for directing and scripting our amazing video! We are very excited about the future and the lasting legacy that we will leave for our future pupils, their families and our community.

Education Penalty Notices

In line with the policy of other local schools and Stockport Council, parents should be aware that with effect from **9.1.23** if holidays or other leave of absence are taken during term time without permission they may be issued with Education Penalty Notices by the Local Authority.

Education Penalty Notices are fixed penalty fines of £60 (rising to £120 if unpaid within 21 days) per parent per child by Stockport Council.

Requests for Leave of Absence

Parents are strongly requested to take holidays during the school holidays. If you wish to request Leave of Absence for any reason we would ask you to do so in writing to me by completing a Leave of Absence request form, which you can pick up from the School office, at least four weeks before the start of the proposed leave.

Medicine:

If your child is currently taking a course of antibiotics and is well enough to be in school we are able administer one dose during the school day. Please fill in the 'administration of medicine form,' which you can download from the website or collect from the school office.
