
All families completing the race will receive an award and the top 3 families will receive extra prizes of sporting equipment.

Mental Health Week 7-13th February

According to **Place2Be**, a children's mental health charity that provides counselling and mental health support in UK schools, around three children in every primary school class have a mental health problem and many more struggle with challenges from bullying to bereavement.

Place2Be launched the first ever Children's Mental Health Week in 2015 to shine a spotlight on the importance of children and young people's mental health. Now in its eighth year, they hope to encourage more people than ever to get involved and spread the word.

This year's theme is 'Growing Together.'

Growing Together is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. Challenges and setbacks can help us to grow and adapt and try new things. However, emotional growth is often a gradual process that happens over time, and sometimes we might feel a bit 'stuck'.

In school next week we will be encouraging our children to consider how they have grown, and how they can help others to grow.

Seesaw & Homework

Some parents have reported that they are having problems logging on to the Seesaw app if they have more than one child in school.

If you are using the same device for each child you do not need a new code each time you log on for each child. You need to click the 'I am a student' button and then scan or type in the original code you received from your class teacher at the start of the year. You will need to keep these codes safe, as you will need them each time you log in. If you have lost your child's Seesaw Log in details, your child's class teacher can print you a new one.

Following feedback from parents about Seesaw and Purple Mash we are going to re look at how we set homework. We want to make it easier to manage for parents and children. I will email you next week with any updates.
