Safer Internet Day

This week we celebrated Safer Internet day. This year's theme is Smart tech, safe choices-Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI.

The focus has been on helping children understand that some of the "smart" things they use—like voice assistants (Alexa or Siri), tablets, and certain games use Artificial Intelligence (AI). Since children this age are often already interacting with AI, the goal is to teach them to be curious but careful.

Nursery:

This week Nursery have been looking at what the internet is and how we can stay safe. We heard a story from Freddy Teddy who told us to only use devices when we are with a trusted adult.

Reception:

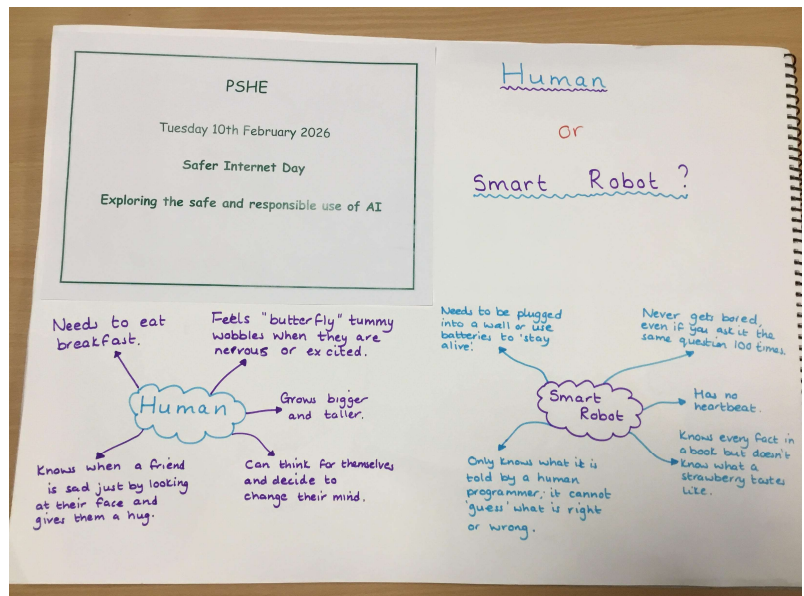
We discussed what the internet is and all the good things it can be used for. We listened to a story about Freddy Teddy and his new tablet. Freddy Teddy came across videos and adverts that were not appropriate for his age. We helped Freddy Teddy to decide what he should do. We talked about how we should always tell a trusted adult if we see something that makes us feel upset or worried.

Year 1:

Year 1 children talked about all the different smart ways we can keep safe online. We also discussed how AI can be used safely and responsibly.

Year 2:

We talked about AI and what it is. We thought in particular about voice assistants like Alexa and Siri. We talked about all of the fantastic things a voice assistant can do but also some of the things we should never ask it to do. We know that a voice assistant is not human and we talked about all of the things that humans can do but voice assistants can't. We remembered the importance of speaking to a trusted adult before we go on the internet or if something worries or upsets us.



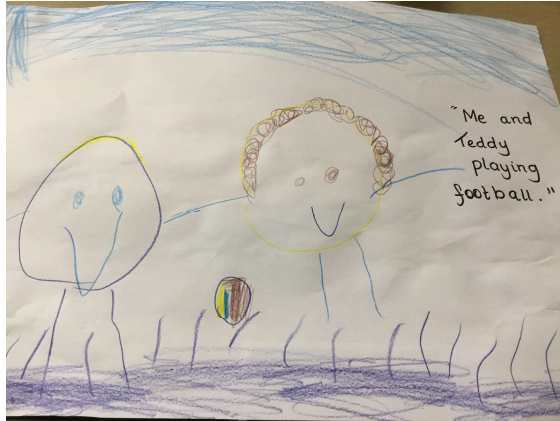
Mental Health Week 9th-13th February

We drew pictures of the places and people that make us smile at school. We also had fun making heart prints and gave them as gifts to some of our nursery friends we don't get to play with very often.



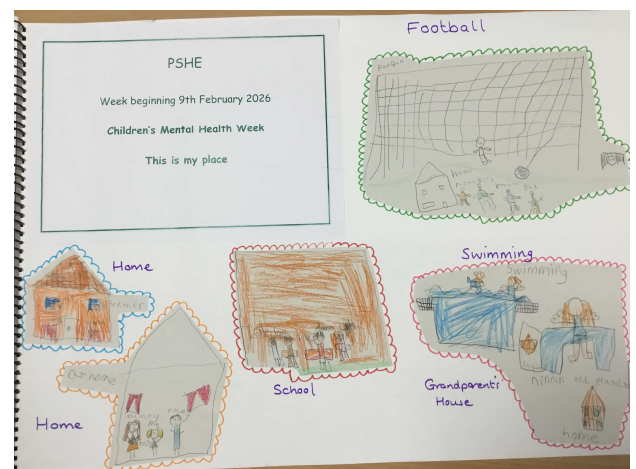

Year 2:

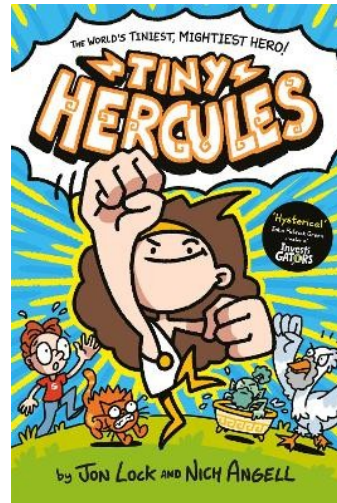

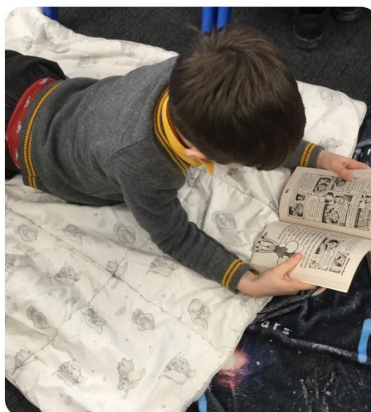
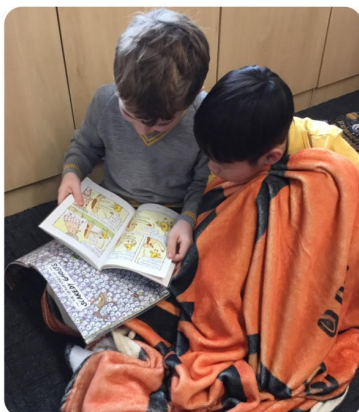
Huge thanks to Simply Books in Bramhall and Mrs Nelson who organised this event for us and created such a memorable and inspiring experience for the children.
