Our response:

PSA: Our PSA team are in a period of transition. We met on Friday to look at calendar dates and events for the rest of the school year, we will share the calendar of events with you next week.

Nursery Wraparound Care: The staff ratios and qualifications required to work with nursery aged children is much higher than children in Reception to Year 2. Therefore, to supervise nursery children in breakfast club and after school club we would require more staff who have the relevant qualifications. As you are aware, we have been advertising for a breakfast club assistant for a number of months now without success. Until we have more staff we will be unable to accept nursery children into wraparound care.

What is car idling?
