Year 1 have learnt how their bodies change and the new skills they develop as they grow older.



#### **Parish News:**

On Sunday St Ann's church will be hosting a Family Day starting at 12pm. The day will be led by the Diocesan Youth Team and the Diocesan Catechetical Team. You are invited to arrive for 12pm with your packed lunch and stay for as long as you can. The day will finish with Mass at 5pm for those who would like to stay until then. There will be talks and activities for children and also for the adults throughout the afternoon.

If you haven't yet returned to Mass with your children after the pandemic this would be the perfect opportunity to re-introduce your children to church and a great way to meet other parishioners.

#### Eid al- Fitr

Many of our Muslim families are currently observing Ramadan. During the month of Ramadan, Muslims won't eat or drink between dawn and sunset. This is called fasting.



Fasting is important during Ramadan as it allows Muslim people to devote themselves to their faith. Ramadan is also a time for spiritual reflection, prayer, doing good deeds and spending time with family and friends.

There is a special festival to mark the end of Ramadan. This is called Eid al-Fitr - the Festival of the Breaking of the Fast. It begins when the first sight of the new moon is seen in the sky. This is a wonderful celebration where families get together and celebrate the good things that have happened throughout the year and often children are given presents!

This year, Eid al-Fitr is expected to be celebrated on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> May or Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. However, the exact date is subject to the sighting of the new moon.

We wish all of our Muslim children and families Eid Mubarak and we look forward to hearing all about your celebrations.

#### **Oliver Twist:**

Traditionally at Cheadle Catholic Infant School we have welcomed M & M theatre company into school for a Christmas pantomime. Unfortunately due to covid restrictions we have not been able to do this for the past two years.

We are, however, delighted to say that M & M theatre company are visiting us on Tuesday 3rd May for an Infant version of Oliver Twist. This will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to experience a trip to the theatre in our own school hall. The performance will be for children in Reception to Year 2. Year 2 children will then have the opportunity to take part in a question and answer session after the performance.

### Stranger Danger:

We speak to the children regularly about stranger danger in school and how they can keep themselves safe. Please see below some useful advice from the local authority.

#### **Protecting younger children**

Statistics show that crime against young children by strangers is rare. Even so, there are steps you can take to help to protect your child:

- Tell your child to avoid talking to people they don't know, unless a you are with them to say it is ok.
- Make sure your child knows never to walk away with people they don't know/know well.
- Plan safe routes with your child- busy and well-lit spaces are best.
- Make sure your child understands that they should always tell you if a someone they don't know approaches them, and never to keep this secret.
- If your child is travelling alone, tell them to sit near other families on the train or bus and near the driver if possible.
- If your child gets lost, they should ask for help from a police officer, another grown-up with children or someone working at a nearby shop.
- Have your children learn their address and an appropriate telephone number by heart

#### **Homes for Ukraine Scheme**

We understand that there are families in our school community who have applied to offer a home to people fleeing Ukraine under the government's Home for Ukraine scheme, and that sponsors could soon be welcoming their guests.

We would like to offer assistance to anyone hosting Ukrainian refugees by bringing together supplies needed to make their stay as comfortable as possible.

Laura Quigley, one of parent governors, has offered to coordinate this. Can we ask that if you are a successful sponsor, you email Laura at her governor email address (below) setting out as much information as you know about the refugees arriving and we will then put out a message to the school community requesting donations for the specific items needed. We hope to be able to offer clothing, bedding, toiletries, toys etc.

We will also request volunteers if needed to help with this effort, depending on the amount of assistance requested.
