#### Float to Live:

In assembly on Monday we reminded the children about water safety.  
We talked about safe places to swim and the importance of always being with an adult.

We then spoke to the children about the 5 'Float to Live' steps that can be followed if they ever got into difficulty in the water.

1. Lie back and tilt your head
2. Relax (It's ok if your legs sink, we all float differently)
3. Move your hands
4. Spread your arms and legs
5. Shout for help!



If you have the opportunity to practise this with your children at the swimming baths, please do. Some of the children told me that they had been practising this in their swimming lessons which is just great!

Ame Eboigbe was awarded third place in the Active Child of the Year Award.

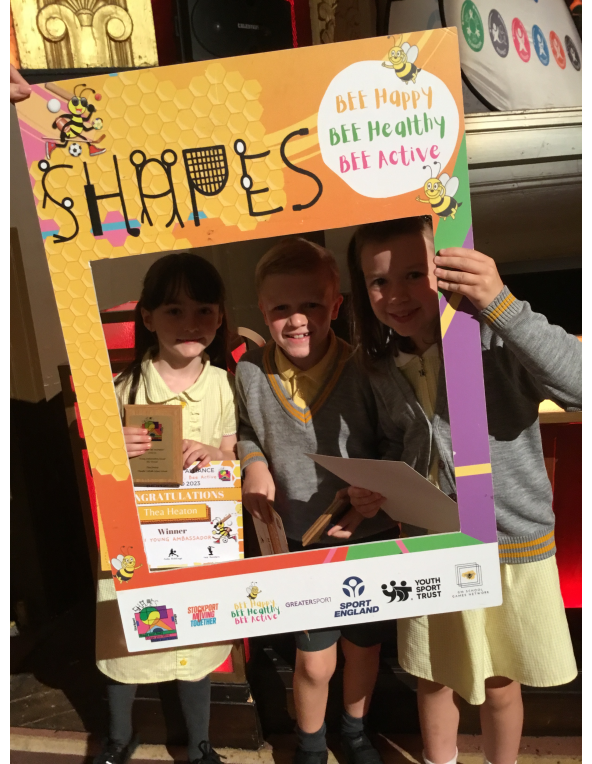
