Important message from Stockport Council about imminent works on Bruntwood Lane (the back path)

Work will start on Monday and the key messages are:

- There will be sectional closures of the Bruntwood Lane path to the rear of the school, between Llanberis Road and Bruntwood Park car park for approximately 8 weeks from 14th July.
- From 14th July for approximately 4 weeks, the path will be closed between the car park and the school gate. Access will be maintained between the school gate and Llanberis Road.
 Pedestrian access between the car park and the school is via the path adjacent to the BMX track - see 'Scheme 12F 1' map attached.
- Following the above for approximately 4 weeks, during the summer holidays to the end of August / start of September, the path will be closed between Llanberis Road and the school gate. Access will be maintained between the school gate and Bruntwood Park. See 'Scheme 12F 2' map attached.
- We'll open paths and/or access to green space whenever safe and appropriate to do so. Diversions will be signed for pedestrians and cyclists, the formal routes being as per the maps, but we recognise alternative routes will also be available at times (e.g. across fields).

Parking should be fine at Bruntwood on 30th August - We will keep you updated as the works progress and in particular if there are any changes to the above.

Please remember to park respectfully whilst the back path is closed.
