NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC's** *Speak out. Stay safe.* **Programme** this term. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed.

Pupil Premium:

Did you know every year schools miss out on essential funding due to confusion around Universal Infant School Meals and Free School Meal Eligibility? All children from Reception to Year 2 receive a Universal Infant School Meal but may also be entitled to Free School Meals.

If you are receiving certain benefits, school can claim Pupil Premium for all children who are entitled to Free School Meals. In order to help school provide the best for your child, we need to make sure we are getting the funding they are entitled to.

Parents need to apply to enable school to receive the extra funding by using the link below: <u>https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/sims</u>

Extra money for the school through Pupil Premium funding is worth at least £900 a year.

Pupil Premium is additional funding for:

- Those children who are registered as eligible for Free School Meals in Reception to Year 2
- Those children who are LAC (Looked After Children) or Post LAC i.e. adopted from care
- Any child who has ever been on free school meals, at any time
- Children of parents serving in the Armed Forces

By registering your child for Free School Meals school receives the additional funding, even if you don't take up the free meal. Registration is completely confidential and it will not affect any other benefits you may be claiming.

This week in school: Black History Month

This year our school theme for Black History Month is 'achievements' and **Year 2** have started to find out about the life of Walter Tull. We have looked at photographs and read extracts from 'Walter Tull's Scrapbook' to help us find out about his early years. The children have lots of ideas about what he might have gone on to achieve-we will find out next week if they are right when we discover more about his life.

Nursery have been learning about Mo Farrah. This week we have been looking at the book Ready Steady Mo and we have been doing the mobot after trying to run like Mo during 'Smile for a Mile!'

Reception have been learning about Jessica Ennis Hill and linking her to our superhero word 'Determination.' We are looking at why she is famous and how she was determined in seven different sports. We discussed personal bests, and how we can improve your own skills and performance. We also talked about how Jessica represented England in the Olympics.



Next week we are going to learn about John Ameachi and how he excelled at

basketball in a short time (3 years.) We will also talk about how he shares his riches with people who are less fortunate than himself.



Year 1 have been learning about Mary Seacole.

We learnt that she was born in Jamaica and had a Scottish father and Jamaican mother. Her mother taught her how to use plants to help sick people.

She paid for herself to travel to the Crimean war to help the soldiers.

Show Racism The Red Card

On Friday 20th October we will be asking the children to wear something red to school (headband, socks, badge, bow) in order to support 'Show Racism the Red Card.' We will be discussing how everyone should be treated with respect, dignity and kindness regardless of colour, race, religion or gender. We will be discussing what is meant by the word 'racism' and what we can do to ensure that we and others know that it is unacceptable. We want our children to understand that racism is not something that should be ignored and that if we all stand up to racism we can make a difference.
