Our Favourite Five Nursery Rhymes This Term...

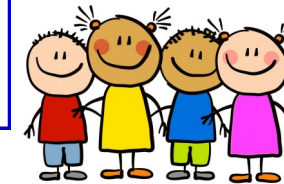


We will be learning these Nursery Rhymes and completing different activities relating to these as well as our focussed targets for this half term.

Key Skills

- To zip up our own coats and dress ourselves independently!
- To answer 'why' questions without picture support e.g. why do you think Miss Polly was sad?
- To sing a large repertoire of songs, knowing many rhymes.
- To use and remember a sequence of movements for our dance to nursery rhymes in PE.
- To work on our cutting skills, cutting with control in a given direction.
- To spot and suggest rhymes, including identifying words that rhyme e.g. cat and hat.
- Show 'finger numbers' up to 5.
- Say one number for each item in order.
- Develop fast recognition for up to three objects without having to count them.

It is believed that if children know 8 Nursery Rhymes by the time they are 4 years old they are usually among the best readers and spellers in their class by the time they are 8. Throughout this term we are going to focus on five Nursery Rhymes with the challenge of learning 3 more at home to share with the rest of the class.
