



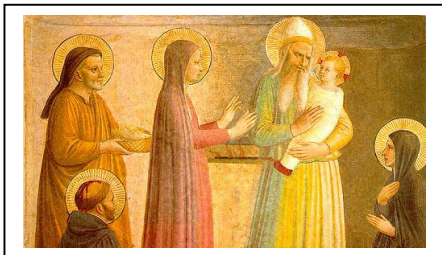
## Love • Respect • Shine

During the winter of Ordinary Time, i.e. up to Lent, we are asked to pray for these intentions:

**Peace on Earth; Christian Unity; The Sick and Those Who Care for Them; Victims of Trafficking and Those who Work to Combat it; The Unemployed.**

## *Nursery & Reception – Galilee to Jerusalem*

During this unit, pupils will hear that:

- The Wise Men visited Jesus.
- Jesus welcomes little children (Mk 10v 16)
- Jesus blesses little children.
- Jesus was born for everyone.

Pupils will believe that:

- The Magi visited Jesus with gifts.
- Jesus is God's Son and came for everyone. Jesus' birth is celebrated at Christmas.
- Jesus came to show God's love and welcomes everyone.
- Jesus takes care of everyone.

Pupils will celebrate:

- That the Church prays the 'Glory Be' as a response to the coming of Jesus.

## *Year 1 – Galilee to Jerusalem*

- Identify some of the people that encounter Jesus and recognise that he is special.
- Retell, in any form, one of the stories they have heard, recognising these are religious accounts from the Gospel of Luke.
- Make simple connections between Jesus' announcement of his mission (Lk 4:16-19) and how Christians are called to tell people about God's love today.
- Ask and answer questions about the story of Zacchaeus and how he changed after meeting Jesus.

## *Year 2 – Galilee to Jerusalem*

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be able to:

- Retell, in any form, the story of John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus.
- Begin to recognise 'parables' as a literary form in Scripture with reference to the parable of the lost sheep (Lk 15:4-7) and how Jesus uses them to teach people about God.
- Recognise that everyone is tempted to make bad choices (sin), but that God loves and forgives all people.
- Correctly use religious words and phrases to recognise how Catholics say sorry to God in prayer and talk about why saying sorry to God and to others is important.
