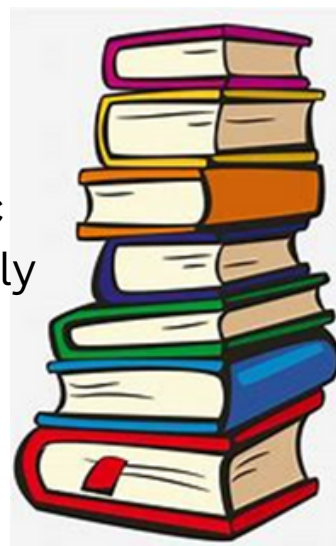
Booknic

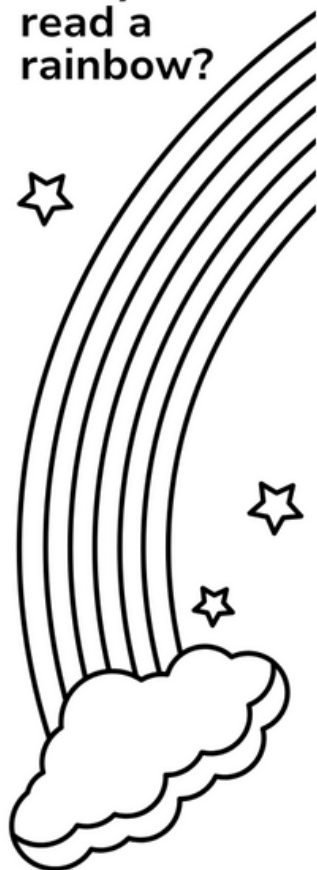
Summer Reading Challenge
