






Year 1—Spring Term 2B



R.E. - Desert to Garden

- Jesus was tempted in the desert for 40 days. Lent is a special time for praying, fasting and helping others as Jesus taught us. Lent is when Christians prepare for Easter by thinking about how they could be closer to God by praying, giving up things that are not needed (fasting), and giving to those in need.
- Hear the story of Jesus going to Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) and teaching in the Temple.
- Hear the story of "The Last Supper" - the special meal Jesus shared with His friends during Holy Week.
- Hear the story relating to the death Jesus and how it affected those around Him. Recognise that the Church teaches that Jesus suffered, died and rose again.
- Hear the story of Easter Sunday when Jesus rose again. Recognise that angels bring God's message and are a sign that Jesus is the Son of God, truly alive.

- Solving problems and discussing how they achieved their answers.


PSHE/RSE
