Year 2 - Week Beginning 12.9.2022



This week we will write a prayer for our classrooms for the beginning of the new school year.

We will introduce our new topic 'The Chosen People' and think about how it feels when you have been chosen.



We will continue to look at place value of numbers within 100. We will be comparing numbers within 100 and counting how many tens and ones each belong to each 2 digit number. We will be using the vocabulary greater than, less than and equal to.



This week we will begin to look at the book 'Cloudy with a chance of Meatballs' by Judi Barrett. We will be exploring the text through drama and writing a diary extract in the first person.





This week we will be going to the library and finding out about how it is organised into different sections. We will complete a scavenger hunt and make library promises to help look after our books.



This week we will look at a variety of plants and sort them according to their different characteristics.





We will look at weather forecasts and what the different symbols mean. We will then work in pairs to come up with their own mini-weather forecasts.



We will reinforce the importance of internet safety. We will continue to learn about 'coding'. We will learn what an algorithm is and how it is presented on a screen. We will build on our prior knowledge from Year 1.



Our PE days are on **Thursday** and **Friday**. The children will be allowed to wear their PE kits in school on these days.

On **Thursday** we will begin our 'Sports Ambassador' training. **Friday** will be **outdoor** PE where we will practise ball skills.



We will look at the work of Monet and identify different shades of blue. We will investigate different tints and tones by adding white or black to blue paint.
